Science, Geography and Art

Science States of matter

- -Compare and group materials together, according to whether they are solids, liquids or gases
- Observe that some materials change state when they are heated or cooled, and measure or research the temperature at which this happens in degrees Celsius (°C)
- -Identify the part played by evaporation and condensation in the water cycle and associate the rate of evaporation with temperature

Mathematics

Place values

Other information - Year 4 expectations

- Spellings: Spellings in Year 4 are arranged into word mountains and your child is tested on their spellings every Friday. New spellings will be given out on Friday and taught in school on a Monday. We expect children to practice spellings at home three times a week.
- Reading: Children are encouraged to read every day and there is an opportunity to change books daily. Every time your child reads, they receive a sticker. All children received a wall chart for home reading which they are awarded in assembly when they complete it. Questions you can ask can be found in reading records. We expect children to read at home least 3 times a week.
- KIRFs (key instant recall facts) We practise KIRFs including times tables daily. Children will bring home a new set of kirfs and multiplication every week. They will be assessed in school once a week.
- School will ensure your child's spellings, Kirfs and multiplications are in their homework book. Please make sure your child brings in their homework book in on a Friday so new set of spellings and Kirfs can be added.
