Parent/ Carer feedback: You Say...We Listen!

Thank you for the completion of the parent survey 2023. It is great to receive positive comments commending the work of the school however it is also important for leaders to consider feedback that could help us to improve.

You said: 'More use of MarvellousMe to share a child's positives.'

MarvellousMe is a parental engagement tool used by school to make it easier for teachers to tell parents about their child's learning and achievements. It is particularly useful to those parents who are unable to drop off/collect their child.

Each child **should** receive at least one personalised positive message home per week linked to their achievements.

When children are happy, they do better. When teachers share positives, they are appreciated and supported by parents.

You said: More homework/less homework/more consistency with homework

The outcome for homework is the same every year with some parents stating there is too much, others too little.

Reading, spellings and maths consolidation is the minimum weekly homework requirement. Your child's class teacher may also signpost you to additional online resources that can be used to consolidate school-based learning.

Teachers are encouraged to set project-based homework and oracy homework to promote interest, engagement and 'talk.' Please speak to your child's class teacher for more information.

You said: Less demands on things costing money

I understand your concerns. School is looking at ways to reduce this wherever possible. Any parent/carer experiencing difficulties/ feeling pressurised financially should speak with Mrs Keighley - Headteacher or Miss Scott - School Business Manager.
